Paraphrasing the words of one writer, thus 'The beauties of nature come in all colors. The strengths of humankind come in many forms. Every human being is wonderfully unique. All of us contribute in different ways. When we learn to honor the difference, and appreciate the mix, we find harmony'

ganda Baati Limited is a very diverse workplace – and increasingly has the company continued to make diversity and inclusion part of its culture.

As we will use the term here, diversity refers to the great variety of human characteristics that make us similar or different from one another. Aspects of diversity may include Sex, Race, Ethnicity, Age, Abilities, Care giving / Parental status, Religion, Values, Class background and marital status.

The above characteristics are to the effect that as individuals we are different from each other in many possible ways and that we can learn things from people whose ideas, beliefs, attitudes, values, backgrounds, experiences, and behaviours are different from our own.

The company has taken initiatives to drive and manage diversity;

Different social backgrounds but same people. The company's workforce over time has been a composition of employees from different social backgrounds, suffice to note Kenya, Sudan, Congo, India to name but a few. I remember the testimony of one of our employees Mr. Charles Opiyo a graduate from Gulu, Northern Uganda. His journey to Uganda Baati Limited as he shared his story was amazing. He did not ever think of being selected as a graduate trainee from an upcountry University to a company in Kampala. He has grown through the ranks to become a planning resource within the Operations department.

Different education qualifications but achieving common goal. When the company opened its doors in 1964, the gates were wide open for everyone as long as he had a skill to contribute to the running of our operations. We had artisans, operators and other shop floor employees who had basic education but grew in the ranks overtime to run the first galvanised line in East Africa. The efforts of our first employees have been complimented by graduates in areas of finance, sales, supply chain, marketing, human resources to name but a few.

Women taking over roles formerly held by men. When I take a look at the demographics of the company, Uganda Baati's story in empowering women is worth mentioning. The story of Ms. Erinah Masiga, an industrial chemistry graduate and the first female Finance Manager in the company is amazing. Our gender ratio has continued to grow with female employees composing of 31% of the workforce.



Initiatives in social interactions. The company has in place social clubs that drive diversity; book readers, fitness, baking and cooking, parte after parte to name but a few. Making friends with others of different backgrounds is often one of the most fulfilling experiences of an employee. We believe that such small efforts to meet and interact with others outside the working environment broaden our horizons and we learn about others different from ourselves.

Learning from the past. We have carried out a number of employee engagement surveys in the workplace and we have drawn lessons from them. One key issue that can stifle diversity is failure by leaders to mingle with subordinates or departments working is silos. It breeds the culture of "Us Vs Them". While consistently encouraging employee bonding sessions, cross functional visits and market storms, we have broken barriers and our employees understand what happens in every function.

What our new employees' experience. Mark it that every year we hold a unique event dubbed "joiners one on one with the CEO". This event is your opportunity as an employer to get feedback on your working environment from the eyes of your recent hires. It is the questions asked and the feedback from the senior team that make a new hire walk away with a better understanding of who we are irrespective of our diversity. Taking part in honest conversations challenge our notions of the workplace and give each other an opportunity to know how we view people from all walks of life.

The future. Our journey to diversity will be more meaningful if this is reflected in our hiring decisions. As a company taking initiatives that cast the net and give opportunities to groups such as refugees will unlock public opinion that is sceptical about such groups, yet there is great potential in tapping into their skills and qualifications.

Putting all of this together, one will undoubtedly agree to the idea, as the great statesman president Obama said, that if you're willing to work hard, it doesn't matter who you are, or where you come from, or what you look like, or where you love -- you can make it in life if you're willing to try." 



Instructions:

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




Campaign Spotlight




